

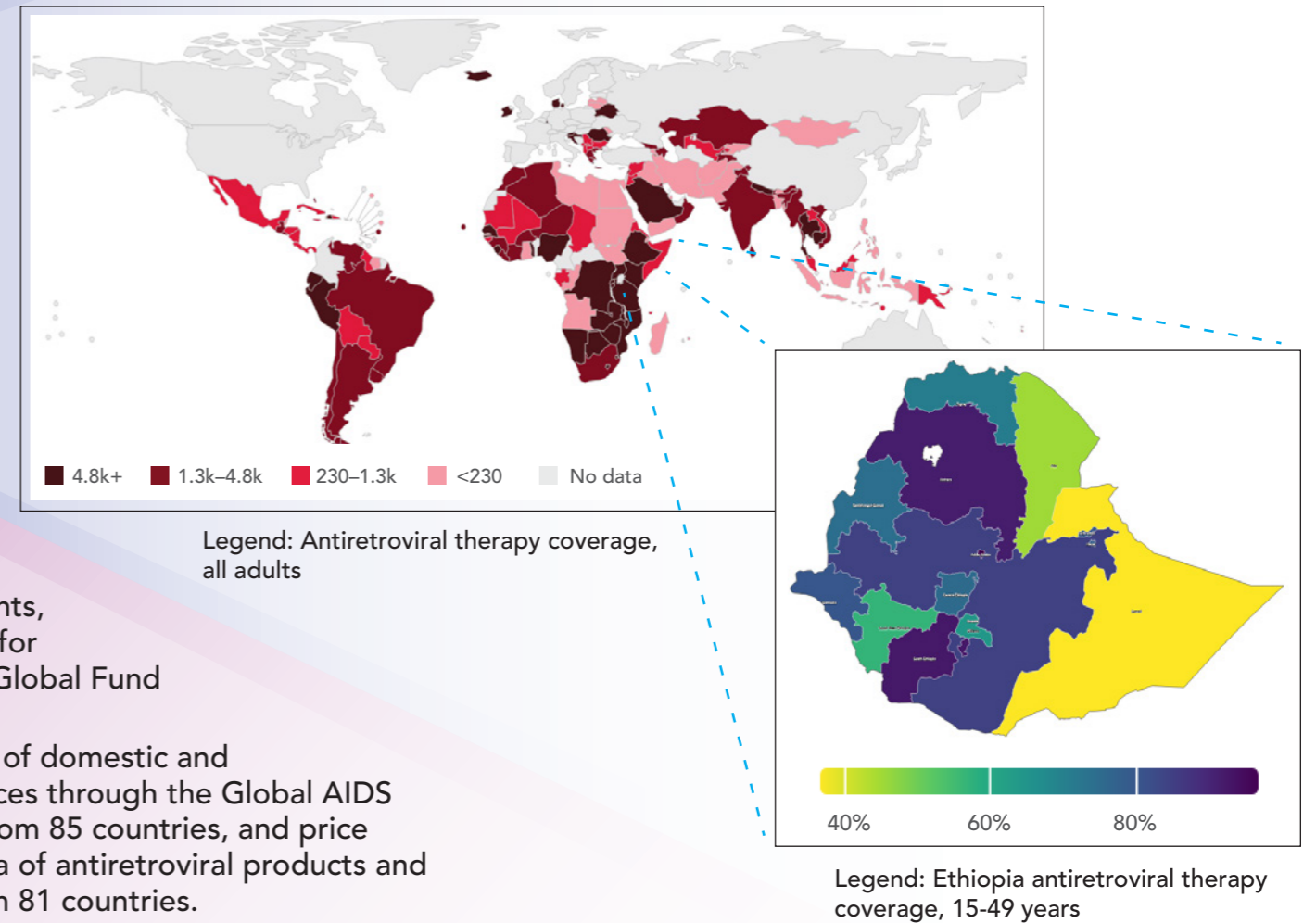
📢 A CLEARINGHOUSE FOR WORLDWIDE HIV DATA

- Key global AIDS reports inform national and global strategic planning, target setting and monitoring.
 - HIV estimates are available for over 170 countries, including 124 with direct support.
 - Up to date knowledge derived on HIV epidemic and response progress and gaps through Global AIDS monitoring indicator data from over 150 countries.
 - Further development of AIDSinfo, including an inequalities visualization platform on the HIV epidemic and response, key populations, policies, laws and finance and differentiated services delivery.

📢 SHARPER PROGRAMMES INFORMED BY MORE GRANULAR DATA

- Stronger national epidemiological surveillance systems, including modelling to identify needs in districts with high-risks.
- Population size estimates, HIV prevalence and antiretroviral therapy coverage estimation tool for key populations available for use in 34 countries in sub-Saharan Africa.
- Increased use of targeted data, such as analysis of vertical HIV transmission, HIV prevention and youth scorecards, HIV testing and treatment cascades, subnational estimates of adolescent girls and young women, and subnational inequalities.
- Guided countries for specific target setting such as for scaling up pre-exposure prophylaxis.

📢 EXPANSION OF COMMUNITY-LED MONITORING

- Over 74 countries with stronger community capacities on community-led monitoring.
- Guidance, tools including new community-led monitoring progression matrix and technical support (to over 35 countries).
- Shared knowledge for quality community-led monitoring implementation to improve HIV services.

📢 IMPROVED EQUITABLE HIV FINANCING

- Used evidence for impactful programmes and investments, especially in 80 countries for evidence-informed HIV Global Fund grants.
- Tracking and analysis of domestic and international resources through the Global AIDS Monitoring data from 85 countries, and price transparency data of antiretroviral products and diagnostics from 81 countries.
- National AIDS Spending Assessments in 21 countries, and HIV and Health Commodity funding assessments in 6 countries led to improved planning, implementation and resource mobilization.
