## EXAMPLES OF PROGRESS SUPPORTED BY THE JOINT PROGRAMME

Among the 12 Global Alliance countries, strong coverage of lifelong antiretroviral therapy among pregnant and breastfeeding women living with HIV was achieved, including in Uganda (almost 100%), the United Republic of Tanzania (98%) and South Africa (97%)

The majority of children living with HIV, mostly in sub-Saharan Africa, have access to preferred paediatric treatment

Health information systems strengthened



Globally, 35 countries have established validation structures and initiated assessment and planned application processes

Certification for eliminating vertical transmission of HIV and syphilis received in Jamaica

New or updated guidelines and tools such as the four-pillar framework for triple elimination of HIV, syphilis and hepatitis B, guidance for paediatric HIV case-finding, and timely HIV diagnosis among children



Increased antenatal and paediatric HIV services in humanitarian settings, including in the Central African Republic and the Democratic Republic of the Congo

Community leadership and clinic collaboration model enhanced psychosocial support for pregnant women in South Africa

The African Union adopted its Triple Elimination Strategy for HIV, Syphilis and Hepatitis B
