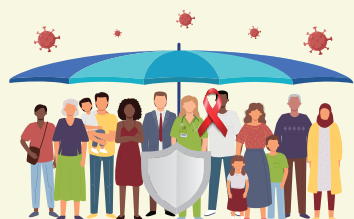


Towards a more equitable and sustainable financing for the HIV response

Impactful financing strategies



- Using the [HIV Response Sustainability Framework](#), more than 30 countries started developing and preparing for the subsequent implementation of sustainability roadmaps, including commitments to increase domestic investments in HIV
- HIV increasingly part of the universal health coverage financing agenda resulting from a more integrated national programming planning and budgeting
- Continuing partnership with the Global Fund and PEPFAR maximized evidence-informed prioritization and returns on investments for most impact
- Enabling countries to use Goals models to project the impact and efficiency of different HIV interventions and to plan cost-effective responses
- Resource needs modelling and Global AIDS Monitoring HIV financing data inform more impactful programmes and investments in more than 80 countries
- Developed granular programme and commodity-level resource needs estimates to achieve global 2030 targets for 118 low- and middle-income countries



Efficiency and effectiveness

- HIV financing trend analysis including sustainability plans, financing assessment and/or integration into domestic budgets in 43 countries
- Antiretroviral services organized and financed as part of national health systems in 73 countries
- Studies completed on resources efficiency, solving bottlenecks and HIV investment cases in 59 countries

Equitable resource use



- HIV financing trends analysis, including systematic review of costs of community-led responses, available on [UNAIDS HIV Financial Dashboard](#) with more than 85 indicators
- Data-driven guidance and technical support for 56 Global Fund country funding requests totalling US\$ 6.8 billion
- National AIDS spending assessments supported in 15 countries to improve HIV resource optimization, accountability and sustainability planning. Health products financing landscapes in four countries
- Data on domestic and international financing for HIV, price transparency, and monitoring of HIV medicines and diagnostics help to improve affordability
- Improved access to health technologies helped 90 countries to achieve savings of US\$ 29 million in procurement of pharmaceutical products



Innovative and sustainable HIV financing

- Resource tracking of community-led responses, and some community-led organizations enabled to conduct cost analyses of HIV interventions
- Guidance and support for sustainable HIV financing, including sustainability plans, integration into domestic budgets, community-led response financing and/or social contracting in 43 countries
- Promotion of innovative HIV financing approaches
